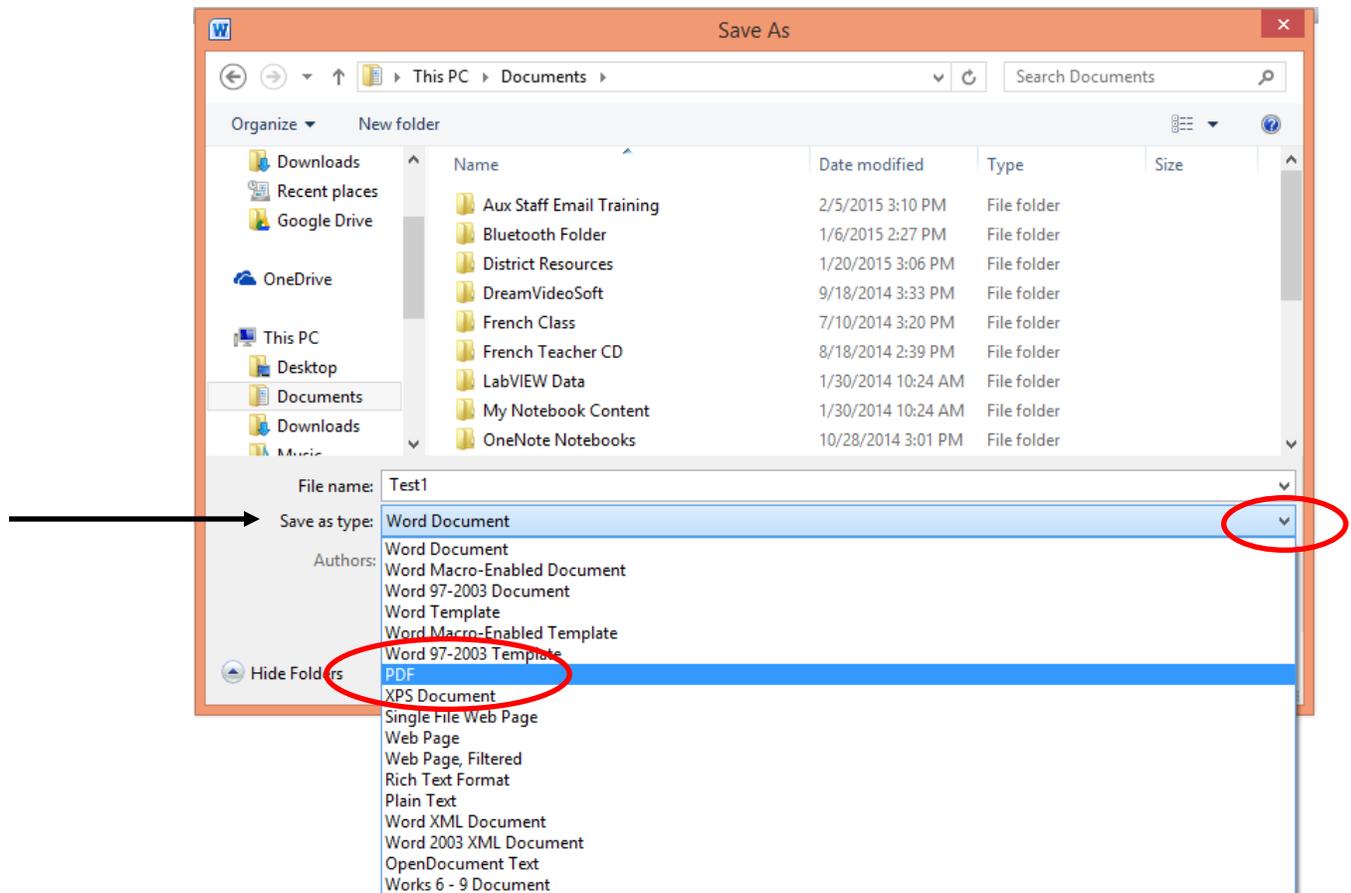
SAVING FILES AS PDF

When you are posting files on your webpage or sharing as an email attachment, be sure they are in a format that everyone can access. Files created, saved, and posted in MS WORD, EXCEL, POWERPOINT, and PUBLISHER might not be accessible to all patrons that view your webpage if they do not have these programs at their disposal. Conversely, if they do have these programs, it is possible for them to edit a document that you do not want edited. To avoid this problem you will need to save your file as a PDF file and post them in that format.

How to do this:

- When you complete a document/spreadsheet/presentation/publication in WORD, EXCEL, POWERPOINT, or PUBLISHER you will need to save it 2 ways.
- First save in the usual way. This will give you a file that can be edited later if needed.
- Then go to File>Save As
- When the Save As box opens, look at the Save As Type box. Use the drop-down arrow to see a list of possible file types.
- Click on PDF
- Then click on SAVE

Now you have a PDF file that can be attached to an email or posted to your webpage.

RESEARCH CITATIONS

It's almost spring, and that brings out the research bug in most English teachers. So I thought I would offer some suggestions that might make citations easier for your students.

MS WORD has several good reference tools that make the research paper process a little easier for students. They are available on the References tab/ribbon of the program. One of these is the Bibliography (or Works Cited) tool. The other is a Citation tool. You can choose the style that is required for your assignment (APA, MLA, or others), enter the required information, and the tool will format the citation for you.

There are also online tools that will create the citation for you with very little effort.

- Easybib www.easybib.com will format citations in APA, MLA, Chicago, and other styles. Easybib also is a Google Chrome Add-on that works seamlessly with Google Docs to find and cite your source (book, journal article, or website) directly in your Google Document.

Most of the topics in the new content include a video and an interactive practice activity. These practice activities can be used individually on computer or other devices, or they can be used with your entire class by projecting onto your SMART Board for students to manipulate.

Class Responder is a free online student response system. It will allow you to collect responses in real time from the students in your class using smartphones, tablets, laptops, or PCs. There are some read-made quizzes and activities available in the program, but you can also create your own multiple choice, true/false, or open-ended questions. Other options allow you to choose self-paced or teacher-paced activities.

Teachers can adjust settings to provide immediate feedback to students. You can also view and email
